




Welcome to March newsletter and hope everyone had a lovely Easter break. March has been another excellent month with 87 patients recruited across 16 sites. We are now more than 10% of the way to the final recruitment target of 2000 patients. Congratulations goes to Lincoln County, Papworth and Victoria Hospital, Blackpool and the teams there who all recruited their first patients this month.

Site initiation visits continue and we would like to welcome Royal Bournemouth Hospital, University Hospital Coventry and Royal Sussex County Hospital in Brighton. Visits are planned this month at Royal Stoke University Hospital and Hammersmith Hospital.

The lucky number this month goes to Leeds who recruited the 200th patient. A special mention also is due as Leeds recruited their 50th patient this month which is an amazing achievement so early in the trial! Data tips and tricks!

From this month the newsletter will regularly feature handy hints from Steve Robertson and Matt Dodd, the ERIC-PPCI data managers. Below are some commonly asked questions and their responses.

Please remember to copy both Matt (matthew.dodd@lshtm.ac.uk) and Steve (steven.robertson@lshtm.ac.uk) in to all correspondence about the eCRF or data for ERIC-PPCI.

- 1. "I can't save a form in the eCRF as the data are incomplete" a draft version of the form can be saved by waiting for 10 seconds within the form and then clicking "return to patient". A pop-up box will appear and "OK" should be clicked. When the additional data is received, click to "add" the form and then "load draft". The additional data can be added and the form saved. Please note though that the data is not submitted until you enter your password to save the form and the form will continue to appear as overdue until it is submitted.
- 2. "I've noticed a mistake on a form that is already saved" edits to the eCRF can only be made by Matt or Steve. Please "create a query" within the form outlining the changes required and we will make the amendments.
- 3. "What point are the follow-ups measured from?" Follow up is measured post-randomisation, not post-PPCI or post-discharge.
