CONDI 2 Collaboration



The ERIC-PPCI trial will be conducted in collaboration with the Effect of RIC on Clinical Outcomes in STEMI Patients Undergoing pPCI (CONDI2) trial (NCT01857414). Prof Hans Erik Bøtker (Aarhus University, Denmark), is the Chief Investigator. CONDI 2 will randomise 2300 patients in Denmark, Spain and Serbia. Recruitment is going very well with 855 patients randomised so far.

The CONDI 2 trial started in November 2013 in Central Jutland, Denmark. In June 2014 the trial opened in the principality of Asturias, Spain. Since then Northern Jutland joined in August 2014 and Southern Jutland in February 2015. The Capital region of Denmark is expected to join in Autumn 2015, followed by Serbia.

The patient pathway for patients with STEMI in Denmark is slightly different to the UK, with longer transit times to fewer, central, PPCI centres. For this reason consent, randomisation and the RIC procedure is carried out in the ambulance prior to the patient being admitted to hospital.

The results of ERIC-PPCI and CONDI 2 will be combined in order to maximise power to assess the impact of RIPC on clinical endpoints. The trials have been very closely aligned as a result. The inclusion and exclusion criteria and endpoints are exactly the same for both trials. While both trials will have their own Trial Steering Committee (TSC) to respond to local issues a combined TSC will be convened for any issues that affect both trials. There are also combined Data Safety Monitoring and Event Validation Committees.

Data Safety Monitoring Committee

As mentioned above, there is a combined CONDI 2 / ERIC-PPCI independent Data Safety Monitoring Committee (DSMC) which will look at combined data for both trials. The first meeting is planned to take place in the next few months.

The role of the DSMC is to review the accumulating trial data for CONDI 2 / ERIC-PPCI and advise the TSC of both trials on the future management of the trials. The DSMC will review combined endpoint and safety data to determine whether there are any unforeseen effects of the RIC intervention.

The chair is Professor Colin Berry, an interventional cardiologist and cardiology research lead at Golden Jubilee Hospital. He is joined by Tom Meade, Emeritus Professor of Epidemiology at London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, and by Dr Andrew Copas an unblinded statistician from the Medical Research Council, London. Danish and Spanish members of the DSMC are to be confirmed shortly. Jenny Nicholas (ERIC-PPCI) and Jakob Hjort (CONDI 2) will provide statistical support to the DSMC.

Profile: Jenny Nicholas

Dr Jennifer Nicholas is a medical statistician who joined London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine in January 2012. Jenny is responsible for producing the reports on the trial data and progress for the ERIC-PPCI Data Monitoring Committee. Jenny has previously been the trial statistician for the REPAIR and ERICCA trials.

Before joining LSHTM, Jenny worked at King's College London where her



research has included design and analysis of clinical trials as well as projects examining the use of epilepsy and diabetes medications and adverse drug reactions.
